## Vehicle Access to The Fairways Residents and Guests

All vehicles will be required to have a Fairways Community Access parking credential throughout tournament week. A parking credential will be issued to each unit in advance of the tournament. Residents should anticipate delays in and out of the Fairways Community between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm. ## Spectator Parking

## Volunteer Parking

Volunteer parking will be available in designated areas on Hillcrest Drive and Westgate Drive. Volunteers may also park in the spectator lot and be shuttled to the main entrance. Limited shuttle services will be available to assist volunteers onto the tournament grounds. Volunteers may access the tournament grounds through one of three entrances. ## Tournament Facts & Overview:

The Frys.com Open leads the PGA TOUR's FedExCup schedule October 6-12, 2014 at Silverado Resort in Napa, California. Fry's Electronics, Inc., based in San Jose, is the title sponsor. The American Institute of Mathematics is the host 501(c)3 charitable organization that presents the tournament and is the primary beneficiary. The Frys.com Open has contributed more than \$6 million to charity since the tournament's inception in 2006. The tournament is operated primarily by approximately 1,200 volunteers for the benefit of charity.

## Tournament Schedule & Tickets:

The tournament is open to the ticketbuying public and corporate guests Wednesday through Sunday, October 8-12, 2014. Silverado members may purchase tickets at www.saveradomembers.com.

Non-Silverado Members may purchase tickets at www.frysopengolf.com.

#### The tournament week schedule is:

- Monday & Tuesday, October 6 & 7: Open to Silverado Members, their accompanied guests, and registered Silverado Resort guests.
- Wednesday, October 8 thru Sunday, October 12: Open to Ticket Holders and Corporate Guests



## **Tournament Grounds**

The tournament grounds will be a secured environment from October 6th to October 12th. A ticket is required to access the tournament grounds at all times. Gate times will be announced, and are expected to open one hour prior to the first tee time and close one hour after conclusion of play. The tournament grounds include, but are not limited to, the Silverado North Course, all practice facilities, the Grill and the main cart staging area. Members and residents may access the tournament grounds through one of the tournament entrances. A map will be provided closer to the event.

## Access to Silverado Resort

Members and Resort guests will be able to access the Silverado Resort throughout the tournament week but may not access the tournament grounds October 8th to October 12th without a ticket. There will be no access to the tournament grounds when the tournament is closed. Ticket holding Members will have access to the Orill October 8th to October 12th during tournament play. All Members with a Silverado membership card will have access to

the Grill upon conclusion of play each evening, at approximately 6.00 pm.

## Member and Resident Cart Parking

Member and resident cart parking will be available near the teeing ground of #2 on the South Course. There will be no cart parking at the Silverado Mansion nor main parking lot areas. The PGA TOUR prohibits any private vehicles and private golf carts inside the tournament grounds throughout tournament week. Golf carts will be allowed on Westgate Drive and Hillcrest Drive to access the South Course. Carts will be able to access the South Course at designated entrances.

## Vehicle Access to Atlas Peak Road

Atlas Peak Road will remain open to the public throughout the tournament week. Atlas Peak Road will be subject to speed restrictions and minor traffic delays at times. Signage will be provided indicating all traffic or parking restrictions.
