The Board of SPOA also serves as the Advisory Committee for the Silverado Community Services District (SCDC), and is under the supervision of the Napa County Board of Supervisors. The SCDC was established to maintain our common property including landscaping, streets, utilities, and beautification projects, and has taxing authority to provide these services through the Napa County Public Works Department.

While SPOA is a volunteer organization, it plays a critical role in administrating our SCDC budget as well as managing the approximately \$16,000 in owner dues received each year, and used to fund landscape projects and other improvements for our community

All property owners are encouraged to join SPOA. It will be the best \$20 you spend this year.

UPDATE SILVERADO REAL ESTATE UPDATE

Property values within the Silverado Residential Community continue to improve as homeowners regain lost equity. I anticipate this trend to last throughout 2014 due to a shortage of properties on the market. The number of "active" Silverado home and condominium listings is lower than it has been for several years.

Silverado condo-hotel prices have stabilized and values are improving. Thirty Silverado condo-hotels sold in 2013.

Napa County home prices escalated in 2013 increasing 27.7% from 2012 price levels.

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE REPORT



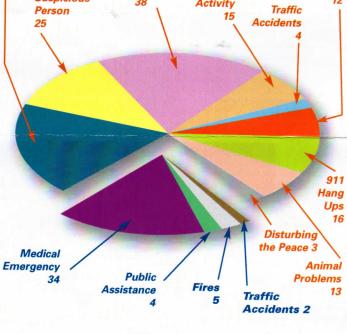
SILVERAD Resort and Spa Welcome rain has brought some green to the Valley, but much more is needed. A" March Miracle" would be most welcome. New landscape projects include renovation of the island on Hillcrest at St. Andrews. We removed the deteriorating landscape and the old, rocky soil, and replaced it with

compost and topsoil. One hundred and fifty new plants were added.

Along the walking path on Hillcrest we are planting drought tolerant, deer resistant plants, accompanied by a weed barrier and decorative river rock of various sizes. This project will stretch nearly one mile and be completed by the end of March
