Informational Community Town Hall Meeting for Victims of the Wine Country Wildfires

Residents, business owners and community members affected by the ongoing Santa Rosa, Napa, Sonoma and Calistoga wildfires are encouraged to attend an Informational Town Hall meeting this coming Wednesday, November 1, 2017 at the Silverado Country Club in Napa. Sponsored by Dickenson, Peatman & Fogarty, the meeting is intended to serve as a resource for wildfire victims seeking guidance on any questions they may have as well as serve as an opportunity to discuss upcoming challenges facing our communities.

Topics for discussion will include insurance issues – how and when to make a claim, what to do about your mortgage if your home was destroyed as a result of fire, concerns of erosion and landslides when the rains return to our region, and possible recovery of uninsured losses.
